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2009-05-01 Minutes: Motion was made by Myzell, seconded by Sterling and unanimously passed to approve the minutes of November 18, 2008; December 18, 2008; January 29, 2009; workshop on February 17, 2009; regular meeting of February 17, 2009; and March 17, 2009. 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2009-05-02 <u>Financial reports:</u> Motion was made by Sterling, seconded by Myzell and unanimously passed to approve the financial reports. Passed

2009-05-03 Repair status-lke: Discussion was brought up concerning the work that is continuing to be done. We are working on the west side of the levee, and the cost for this clay material is \$9.00 per yard for everything. The County has received CDBG money and the Navigation District should receive \$6 million for the east side of the levee, as long as the project falls under the scope of failure to function or damaged by the storm, and according to Mayor Jackson this money is guaranteed. From what we've heard we are getting closer to the 90/10 split.

2009-05-04 <u>Bank Depository Bid:</u> Motion was made by Myzell, seconded by Herrington and unanimously passed authorizing the General Manager to advertise for bank depositor for the District.

2009-05-05 Federal Grant-U.S. Department of Commerce: came before the board to talk about the marina project and from his understanding the District would reconsider if the City of Anahuac and the Anahuac Municipal Development District were interested in coming in as 1/3 partners each. The City of Anahuac has met and they have agreed to come into an interlocal for 1/3 of the project. The MDD meets tonight and he has talked with the Chairman of the Development District and the Chairman is amenable to this project. The City will be in for 1/3 and the MDD will be in for 1/3. If the grant is awarded, it comes out to \$45,000, is what each one of us will be responsible for of the \$135,000.00. In the grant there is 10% administration provision that comes back to the entities. If all this fails, the most each entity will be out will be \$5000.00. This money has nothing to do with ORCA or HGAC. We have not decided who will be the person who will oversee the project. This will not be in competition with the project the County has at Joe Beason Park. Motion was made by Sterling, seconded by Myzell and unanimously passed to go along with Mayor Jackson's proposal to sponsor 1/3 of the study in the amount of \$5000.00.

2009-05-06 <u>West Chambers County Water Project-Amendment to Certificate of Adjudication & Amendment to Region H. Plan:</u> Pudge Willcox stated the amendment to the certificate of adjudication is still in the process through TCEQ.

Mr. Willcox stated in order for us to get funding through the Water Development Board there has to be an amendment to the Region H Plan. The Region H plan has to be updated in 2010 and instead of having Chuck Settle do the table amendments, we will have the Region H consultants make a natural amendment to the new plan that will be adopted in 2010. Mr. Willcox stated we have not had any more people saying they want water on the west side.

2009-05-08 Roger Baham-Lake Anahuac Marsh: Mr. Baham came before the board to discuss 500 acres he has leased on the north side of Lake Anahuac, where he has cattle. It has been under water for six weeks and he was wondering when the District will be able to pump it out so he can utilize his grass. The canal superintendent stated the only way to get this water out is to pump and with the amount of rain, we haven't been able to get the pumps back in; it may take another month.
2009-05-09 Resolution donating life boat to Texas A & M Maritime Academy: Motion was made by Sterling, seconded by Myzell and unanimously passed to execute the resolution donating the Thompson Lykes life boat to Texas A & M Maritime Academy. Passed
2009-05-10 Irrigation water 2009 crop year: Due to the salinity still located in Lake Anahuac, motion was made by Sterling, seconded by Herrington and unanimously passed to that no fresh water will be available for rice this year. Passed
2009-05-11 <u>Public Comment:</u> Mrs. Payne stated the Navigation District doesn't need to take the lead on the marina project.
There being no further business, or public comment, motion was made by Myzell, seconded by Sterling and unanimously passed to adjourn. Passed
